

WGRF Members Update December 2024

\$11.5 M approved for new research funding over the next five years

In late November, the WGRF Board approved \$11.5 million in new research funding over the next five years.

This research was strategically chosen to meet WGRF's goals of investing in variety development and production research that will benefit western Canadian grain farmers, says Board Chair Laura Reiter.

"This fall, our Research Committee spent two days in meetings reviewing this year's collection of research proposals. Their recommendations were discussed by the Board during the November Board meeting and funding decisions were made. We do this to ensure we are making the soundest decisions with farmers' investments."

Reiter says the most recent research and capacity investments remain focused on helping farmers navigate ongoing production challenges related to weather variability and weed, disease and insect threats in western Canada.

"We also remain focused on funding sustainable long-term strategies for resource management and plant nutrition, taking a whole farm, multi-crop approach," she says.

WGRF's committed research expenditures from 2024 to 2030 is more than \$47 million, investments that have been made for farmers, by farmers, says Reiter.

"A big thank you to our farmer Board members for all their hard work reviewing research and making these investments happen."
